

In Geography, Years 1 and 2 have been learning about hot and cold climates and weather in different countries.






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

Molly recreated a dome mountain.








We used fudge icing to recreate a volcanic mountain.

Here we showed how erosion, caused by wind and rain, creates a plateau mountain.

Class 3 looked at how different kinds of mountains are formed, using everyday items! Mountains grow really slowly; Mt Everest, the world's tallest mountain, gets 4mm taller each year. So during the ten years our Year 6s have been alive, Everest has grown 40mm taller!
