During our celebration assembly, the whole school enjoyed watching a video clip of the performance, sharing in the pride and excitement of the occasion.




Year 5 and 6 Pupils Master Life-Saving CPR Skills

Year 5 and 6 pupils recently participated in essential CPR training delivered by two British Heart Foundation trainers. The children displayed exemplary attention and followed instructions diligently throughout the session. Learning CPR is crucial even for young people; When someone suffers cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR reduces survival chances by 10%. With over 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests annually in the UK and less than one in ten people surviving, these skills are

invaluable.

Children as young as 10 can perform effective CPR. While they may lack adult strength, knowing how to call for help, position someone safely and begin chest compressions can make a vital difference in an emergency.
Our pupils should feel proud of acquiring these important life-saving skills that prepare them to be responsible, helpful citizens.







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<u>Class 1 Pupils Navigate New</u> <u>Horizons with Bee-Bots</u>

Class 1 pupils have been buzzing with excitement during their computing lessons as they master the use of Bee-Bots. These small, friendly robots have quickly become a classroom favourite, with children eagerly programming them to navigate simple routes across the classroom floor.

What are Bee-Bots?

For parents and carers unfamiliar with these educational tools, Bee-Bots are childfriendly programmable floor robots designed specifically for young learners. With simple directional buttons (forward, backward, left and right), children input a sequence of up to 40 commands before pressing 'Go' to watch their Bee-Bot follow their instructions. Our collection includes various Bee-Bot designs, with some being see-through, allowing children to observe the internal mechanisms and gain a basic understanding of how the technology works.

Through this hands-on experience, pupils develop early programming skills, directional language and logical thinking.

Applying Skills Across the Curriculum

The skills gained through Bee-Bot activities have transferred wonderfully to other areas of learning. Children are now applying their understanding of directional language in creating maps in geography and using sequencing skills during story time. Many pupils have also demonstrated improved problem-solving abilities when faced with challenges in other subjects.

"It's remarkable to see how quickly the children grasp these concepts and apply them elsewhere," notes Mrs Reynolds, Class 1 teacher. "When a Bee-Bot doesn't reach its intended destination, the children naturally begin to debug their instructions – a fundamental computing skill they're developing without even realising it!"

Computing in the Early Years and Key Stage 1

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) and Key Stage 1 computing curriculum introduces children to the foundations of computational thinking. Rather than focusing solely on screen-based activities, the curriculum emphasises understanding algorithms (sets of instructions) through practical, hands-on experiences.

By the end of Key Stage 1, children should be able to create and debug simple programs, use logical reasoning to predict behaviour, and understand how algorithms are implemented as programs on digital devices – all skills our Class 1 pupils are confidently developing through their Bee-Bot adventures. As our young programmers continue to develop these essential 21st-century skills, use loads for work to extend to use their second to use the size of the second to use the second
